#### NAPLAN 2024 NATIONAL ASSESSMENT PROGRAM – LITERACY AND NUMERACY INFORMATION FOR PARENTS AND CARERS

Dear Parents/Carers,

This year, the National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be taking place in the latter part of Term 1. The 2024 NAP testing period for all Year 3, 5, 7 & 9 students is scheduled to commence on Wednesday March 13 and conclude on Monday March 25.

For your information, the NAPLAN tests are conducted by the Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA) on behalf of the Australian Curriculum, Assessment and Reporting Authority (ACARA). The results of these tests provide diagnostic information for parents and teachers about a child's performance in literacy and numeracy. This information can be used to support teaching and learning programs and improve student achievement.

Teachers and students will be working hard in preparation for a positive NAPLAN experience and we aim to provide maximum support for students participating in the tests. All assessment tasks will be conducted online, except Year 3 Writing, which remains a pen and paper test. The assessments for our school are scheduled as follows:

Wednesday March 13 – Writing
Thursday March 14 – Reading
Friday March 15 – Conventions of Language [Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling]
Monday March 18 – Numeracy

Testing generally occurs in the first half of the day. Further details will be communicated soon.


It is expected that all children participate in the NAPLAN tests. Special provisions can be arranged for a student with a disability if he/she regularly accesses such support for classroom assessment tasks. If you feel that your child may require adjustments to participate, please discuss this with your child's teacher no later than February 28. The parent teacher interviews in week 3 will provide an opportunity for you to do so.

Exemptions may be granted to students with significant intellectual or complex disabilities and to students who have been learning English for less than a year. If your child is eligible for a special provision or an exemption you should discuss this with your child's teacher as soon as possible. Exemption and Withdrawal forms must be completed prior to the commencement of the testing period. Neither special provisions nor exemptions can be granted without parental consent.

To help the Year 1/2 children locate personal belongings easily, we ask that all items are to be clearly labelled. Many unnamed items, including clothing, hats, drink bottles, and snack containers are sent to the lost property every week. Often personal items have been labelled in the past, but due to regular wear and tear names have worn off. Please name/rename all personal items.

Thank you to all families who have sent along their child's items as listed on the year-level booklists. If you haven't already done so, please send in all items as soon as possible; including an art smock, library bag, calculator (Year one and two only), headphones and school hat.

Each day your child requires a recess snack to eat at 10:55 am, a 'Sip and Crunch' piece of fruit, vegetables or cheese to eat at 10:00 am and a healthy lunch to eat at 1:35 pm. We promote the idea of 'less is best' regarding food wrappers in children's lunchboxes. Your support in helping us reduce rubbish is greatly appreciated. All children are also required to bring a named water bottle daily to aid hydration and concentration during learning time.

#### Reminder:

- Alfredton Primary School is a 'nut-free' school, and therefore no food items containing nuts are to be brought or consumed at school. This includes peanut butter or Nutella in sandwiches, or any other food items containing nuts.
- Children must wear a green, broad-brimmed school hat when playing outside. Please check that your child has a hat to wear.
- Please place a small sunscreen, appropriate for your child (roll-on preferred, no aerosol allowed) in their bag.

#### Foundation:

Last week, we welcomed our 2024 Foundation students and their families into the classroom to participate in individual interviews and assessments. Thank you to all families and children for supporting this process. The data collected will help provide us with additional information so we can plan to support your child's learning needs.

It was lovely to see the many happy smiling faces as children arrived for their first day of school on Monday. This week our Foundation children have been having a lot of fun learning their new school routines, meeting their teachers and making new friends.

We hope you enjoyed our family picnic evening. We had a fabulous time talking to the children and their families in a fun and relaxing environment.

We are excited for the year ahead and look forward to working with you to provide a fabulous year of teaching and learning for your children. Please do not hesitate to message us through Dojo if you have any questions.

#### Year 1 and 2:

Our Home Reading program will commence this week. Children are encouraged to read daily to an adult to practise fundamental reading skills, such as fluency and expression. Take home books are strategically selected just below your child's actual reading level to ensure they are easy for your child to read. This allows their home reading to be an enjoyable experience that builds their confidence and love of reading.

Their Home Reading satchels/bags are to be brought to school each day so they can learn this important home reading routine. Please assist with the program by listening to your children read and recording the books they read in their Home Reading Diary. The children also received a Term 1 Speaking and Listening roster on their transition day with different topics to talk about or prepare for each week. We thank you in advance for supporting your child with their weekly class presentations in this valuable program.
